Day on the Hill

Tuesday May 6th, Advocates Katie Foley and Roseann Polishan headed to the Capitol in Harrisburg PA to participate in the Arc of PA's "Day on the Hill" to advocate for rights for those with intellectual and developmental disabilities. Some of the top issues include DSP wages, the waiting list for Medicaid Waivers, Early Intervention and Special Education Funding, nursing for Complex medical needs and increased dental benefits.

They started off their day at the Press Conference in the East Wing, where they heard the rallying call that disability rights are human rights from Sherri Landis, Executive Director of the Arc of PA, along with a number of Senators and Representatives, Self Advocates and family members. Then they spent the day meeting with 7 legislators,



then dropping off packets to 9 additional legislators' offices and networking with other advocates.

It was a successful day of advocacy and they are hopeful it will turn into votes for these important areas of legislation!


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President's Message

Autism Awareness and Acceptance with Fox News

Katie was interviewed by reporter Samantha Durante about some of the controversy on autism in the news as of late. Katie was quoted the following in regards to the potential for individuals with autism.

"Parents like Kate Foley, an advocate with the Arc of Northeastern Pennsylvania, agree. "For many years, people with disabilities were told to stay in institutions. How are we supposed to know what they're capable of if we didn't take the

chance to find out what they're capable of," said Foley.

Roseann was interviewed by Reporter Elizabeth Haikes about Autism awareness month highlighting local resources and early intervention and was quoted the following "support can also come from places like The Arc Northeastern Pennsylvania. Lead Advocate Roseann Polishan says her work is deeply personal, as her son was diagnosed with autism when he was two years old. "I want him to be the best he can be. I feel like he has unlimited potential. He needs a lot of support to have a happy, successful life and he has a lot of challenges. I just want to help him the best I can, but he has the same right as

everyone else," said Polishan.

Recently we had a day at the races. All individuals picked the horse they thought was their lucky one. If they



The Arc of Northeastern Pennsylvania Names Marsha Pigga as Executive Director

The Arc of Northeastern Pennsylvania, a non-profit organization committed to people with intellectual and developmental disabilities IDD, has named Marsha Pigga their new Executive Director. The Arc-NEPA is a grassroots organization formed in 1955 by a group of parents seeking public education for their children with IDD. Since that time a growing number of parents, neighbors, and members of the business and professional communities have faced numerous challenges in advocating for children and adults with IDD.

Previously, Ms. Pigga was the Executive Director of Domestic Violence Service Center which is a nonprofit organization committed to working towards an end to the problem of domestic violence in our culture. Domestic Violence Service Center is founded in the belief that violence in the home is a crime, primarily committed against women and children, which has a devastating impact on the lives of all family members and society as a whole.

Prior to the Domestic Violence Service Center, Marsha served as the Executive Director of the Children's Advocacy Center of Northeastern Pennsylvania where she delivered over 20 years of experience in non-profit administration providing mission-focused results through team-oriented strategic processes. Her culmination of experience working in mental health counseling and mental health administration fostered her success in creating a culture of care to further the mission.

Ms. Pigga holds a MA from Marywood University and a BS from King's College. She served as a Student Assistance Program Regional Trainer and Commonwealth Prevention Alliance State Board Member and is a former member of the Scranton Counseling Center Board of Directors, Trauma Informed Care Community Committee, NEPA Task Force Against Human Trafficking and the University of Scranton Graduate Nursing Program-Community Advisory Board.

"We are thrilled to welcome Marsha Pigga to The Arc," said Bill Burnell, Board President. "She brings an impressive combination of experience, vision, and energy. Her passion for service aligns with The Arc's mission of ensuring that people with IDD in Northeastern Pennsylvania are valued, respected, and fully included in the community."

Pigga expressed enthusiasm about joining The Arc. "I welcome the opportunity to lead an organization that has such a wonderful impact on the community," she said. "To continue the mission and hard work will be a privilege."
