### Interview with Mari Pizur, Recreation Service Coordinator of The Arc of NEPA



#### Can you tell us your job title?

Currently, I serve as the Recreation Service Coordinator of the Arc of NEPA located in Scranton.

#### What are some of your responsibilities?

My main responsibility is to ensure that we provide meaningful and integrated recreational experiences weekly for our participating adults in Lackawanna and Carbon Counties.

Another responsibility is our summer camp program. We have sixty campers at the Weston Park in Scranton for a five week summer camp program. Those attending the summer camp range in age from six years to twenty-one years of age. All the camp participants have some special needs.

### What are some of the challenges that you face?

One of my biggest challenges comes with trying to integrate as much as possible. For example, we have 169 Arc participants who enjoy bowling in our bowling leagues. When we have a bowling banquet, we have over 400 persons because we include parents, staff members and aides. It is the Gala Event of the Year!

We also work with Mohegan Sun and with the Scranton Cultural Center as well as JZ tours to plan a variety of entertainment options for our participants. We got to see the Jersey Boys when they came to Scranton! Each year we have a birthday party for everyone! Birthday parties are always fun! We have to be creative and we have to work at integrating approximately 100 Arc participants in with community members.

We also have a basketball game with the Scranton Police as a fundraiser. Our employees play against the Scranton Police officers. If there is a foul committed, our Arc participants are allowed to shoot the foul. The money we raise from this fundraiser is donated to families that are some way related to our Arc of NEPA. When a family is in a critical situation, we try to help them wherever possible.

### What is one of your favorite parts of the work you do?

I have been called the "Fun Lady" because I have the opportunity to create fun projects for our Arc participants.

We truly enjoy coming to Keystone College because our Arc participants can dance with the Keystone College students, enjoy arts and crafts and have some pizza and desserts, side by side with the college students and staff. We come to Keystone College on Valentine's Day and Halloween each year.

#### What are some of your goals for the upcoming year?

One of our most important goals is to integrate more into the community. I would like to see recreation for all ages!

### How many participants do you have in the Arc of NEPA?

We have 480 participants on our mailing roster. On a weekly basis, we serve between forty and one hundred participants.

#### How many staff members work with the Arc of NEPA?

We have 145 staff members in our agency. For each group home we have approximately four Arc participants and a group home supervisor. Currently, we have eleven group homes in this region.

### What is your educational background for this work?

I have a background in Human Services and a background in Business Administration.

### How has your educational background helped you in this work?

In the business world, you have to know your people.

In the world of people, you have to know your business.




