## Pennsylvania Department of Human Services - Office of Developmental Programs Budget F.Y. 18-19

On Friday, June 22nd, the Pennsylvania General Assembly passed its Fiscal Year 2018-2019 Budget Bill, well ahead of the June 30th deadline. On Thursday, July 12th at the

Pennsylvania Advocacy & Resources Membership Meeting, Office of Developmental Programs, Director of the Bureau of Financial Management, Rick Smith, provided an overview of the ODP budget for 18-19:

ODP received a \$45.2 million increase in state revenue in the approved 2018-2019 budget. Rick added that the budgetary objectives include:

- \$4 million to serve an additional 100 people from the Emergency Waiting List
- \$102 million to serve 800 graduates of the special education class
- \$697,000 for adults with autism

- \$1.1 million for transitioning 25 individuals from state centers to community
- Annualization of F.Y. 18-19 program expenses

We are pleased to see funding for the Emergency Waiting List and high school graduates. Yet we remain concerned about the proposed rates for transportation on the proposal may result in reduced rates that fail to cover costs. We are equally concerned that the budget did not include funding necessary to continue the department's commitment to direct service professional wages through a cost of living adjustment.

Advocacy is critical and as a member of the Pennsylvania Advocacy and Resources (PAR) an organization whose mission is to strengthen the capacity of service providers across the state, The Arc of NEPA has the opportunity (and responsibility) to stay informed, to speak out on budgetary and regulatory issues and to advocate in matters that may impact the children, adults and families we serve.



## Shaken Baby Syndrome (SBS)/Abusive Head Trauma (AHT)



Shaken baby syndrome (SBS) or Abusive Head Trauma (AHT) is caused by vigorous shaking of an infant or young child by the arms, legs, chest or shoulders. Forceful shaking can result in brain damage leading to intellectual disability, speech and learning disabilities, paralysis, seizures, hearing loss and even death. It may cause bleeding around the brain and eyes, resulting in blindness. A baby's head and neck are especially vulnerable to injury because the head is so large and the neck muscles are still weak. In addition, the baby's brain and blood vessels are very fragile and easily damaged by whiplash motions, such as shaking, jerking and jolting. Shaken baby syndrome has been identified by other names such as abusive head trauma, shaken brain trauma, pediatric traumatic brain injury, whiplash shaken infant syndrome and shaken impact syndrome.

Shaken Baby Syndrome is the most common cause of mortality and accounts for the most long-term

disability in infants and young children due to physical abuse. The true incidence of SBS is not known, but estimates range from an annual figure as low as 600 cases per year in the United States to as high as 1400. One shaken baby in four dies as a result of this abuse. Head trauma is the most frequent cause of permanent damage or death among abused infants and children, and shaking accounts for a significant number of those cases. Some studies estimate that 15 percent of children's deaths are due to battering or shaking and an additional 15 percent are possible cases of shaking. The victims of shaken baby syndrome range in age from a few days to five years but most often involve children younger than 2 years of age.

# The Right to Education Task Force

The Right to Education Task Force can be a powerful tool for parents and families. It was derived from the 1972 PARC Decree, where Pennsylvania children with or thought to have intellectual disability were guaranteed the right to a free public education program. Out of this decree came a plan to identify, locate, and evaluate children with intellectual disabilities, as well as establish due process procedures and State and Local Task Forces (one for each intermediate unit) to ensure these priorities are carried out throughout the state.

Our Local Task Force for IU 19 has increased membership and attendees over the last 2 years and hope's to build on this momentum. The Arc of NEPA continues to support this invaluable resource as a key member of the Task Force.

The meetings for the 2018/19 School Year will take place at The Arc of NEPA boardroom at 9:30 am on October 16th, November 20th, February 12th, April 16th and May 7th. The March 19th meeting will be at 6 pm. Some of the topics this year include, ESY, SETT evaluations, Procedural Safeguards of the IEP, Financial Planning for Special Needs Individuals, Lekotek/Compu camp and Waivers and ID /Autism Services. - Roseann Polishan




