Remembering 2015



A January morning in 2055..... A group of parents, friends, self-advocates, and staff started to plan for the 100th. Together they would brain storm ideas for The Arc's 100th Anniversary. But there was no meeting. There wasn't a group of people together in one room. Folks who were participating in this "meeting" were provided an electronic agenda and were asked to give some thought to how and when they would like to celebrate this remarkable milestone. At precisely 9am, the virtual meeting began and each member directed their thoughts to the special anniversary events that they would like to see throughout the year- 2055. "CHIP", an electronic device voluntarily implanted in men, women and children since 2043, signaled the end of texting, tweeting and emails. With CHIP people can simply transmit their thoughts, create 3D images and cause an action to take place simply through thought. So the Development Committee for The Arc's 100th Anniversary, (as they called themselves), transmitted their thoughts on the matter to a single electronic site where the information was shared with others and stored.

One young man did his meeting/thinking as he was transported to work in his "auto-auto", the current mode of transportation. He left his home, sat down in his auto-auto, and thought about opening the garage door. He then directed his thoughts to where he would like to go. His thoughts, just his thoughts, working through CHIP, opened the garage door and programed his electric auto-auto to the corresponding coordinates for his desired destination. The auto-auto does the rest. While he being transported, a 3D image of the Executive Director for The Arc appeared like magic not only to this young man, but to all those participating in the "meeting". The Executive Director suggested that they review the milestones of The Arc and how other anniversaries were celebrated. They looked at the 50th Anniversary, then the 60th when instantly, a 3D image of a top hat and magic wand appeared to everyone. There was a collective awe from the group. The Executive shared the details of The Arc's 60th Anniversary. There was a juggler, and a magician, he said. "It was a gala held in October that guite creatively celebrated that "Magic Happens at The Arc". As an old article from Scranton Times - August 2015 - flashed before the committee members, the Director shared that 2015 was a particularly challenging time for citizens with intellectual and developmental disabilities and for The Arc. "The state didn't pass a budget until December that year! " If that wasn't bad enough", he said, "waiting lists for services were growing longer because there wasn't adequate

"And The Arc still believed in magic?", the young man asked. The Director went on, "Well, there hasn't been a year when The Arc didn't face challenges. Remember, The Arc was born 100 years ago because parents wanted their little ones with disabilities to be able to go to the same school as their brothers and sisters. Over the years, we have fought for housing in communities, quality health care and services for those we love. Even today, as we plan to celebrate our 100th Anniversary, we have much to do. Our citizens with developmental disabilities should have the same access to the virtual world we now enjoy. They will be able to have their own "CHIP", their own "auto-auto as well as proper and necessary supports. Just as The Arc had promised their stakeholders in 2015, we

President's Message

They are making many renovations, repairs, updates and conversions to their sites and that would not be possible without the generosity of several Foundations. We are so

grateful for their continued support and belief in our mission. I have been honored to be a part of The Arc's 60th

Exec's Corner

Over the last few weeks, I have had the opportunity to share some thoughts regarding our 60th anniversary. I would like to share them with you now.

The Arc began in the mid 50's by and for parents and family members as a support group to assist each other in educating, training and improving the lives of their children and family members.

The Arc of The U.S. had humble beginnings and has grown to over 850 chapters, represented in every state with nearly 100,000 members nationally. We are the largest national organization whose mission it is to serve the needs of, provide services, supports and advocacy to people with Intellectual Disabilities and their families. Those members give us clout when we speak to our legislators, and by the way we are blessed with well informed and supportive legislators from all levels; county, state and federal.

Let me throw a few dates at you:

1950's – The local Arc of Lackawanna County began. We were part of Allied Services on Cedar Avenue. We ran a summer camp.

1956 – Mary Campbell hired as our 1st Executive Director.

1960's – We moved with Allied to the complex on the Morgan Highway. We started Adult Day Services with 6 employees and 30 consumers.

In the early 60's, with the encouragement of our parent group, the Scranton School District held its first class for children with disabilities, one of the first in PA.

1966 – MH-MR Act – Many community services began.

1972 – PA Right to Education Act – I was hired as Program Coordinator-half time

1975 – PL 94-142 – Federal Right to Education Act

1978 – I was hired as our 2nd Executive Director.

1980 – The Arc PA sues the state over horrible conditions at Pennhurst and it eventually closed. When I started with The Arc, there were over 13,000 people with ID in state centers. Today, there are less than 1,000 (985).

1984 – We moved to Meadow Avenue. Began Community Residential Services, serving a number of those former residents of Pennhurst, mostly men with significant levels of disabilities.

1990's to early 2000's – All services grew and were embellished. People continued to come home from state centers.

2006 – We expanded into Carbon, Monroe, Pike, Susquehanna and Wayne counties. We became The Arc of NEPA.

Anniversary Celebration. The Gala was held on October 22nd and Peter Danchak was the Master of Ceremonies for the evening. The room at Fiorelli's was transformed into a sea of activity and there was so much to watch and have your senses mesmerized. We were met with Rob Smith, the juggler, who had kept several flames in the air at one time and then led into a magical wonderland filled with illusions, fine and plentiful food, history, art, photos, amusement and so much that before we knew it the night was over. Today – We serve over 300 people per week in various programs and services including residential, day support, advocacy and recreation and employ over 170 staff.

We have accomplished in those 60 years but there is so much more to do.

- We want to move more people from state institutions to communities back home
- We want greater opportunities in employment for all with I.D. who want to work
- We want to stop the bullying of people with ID and Autism
- We want to provide better community education in the prevention of Fetal Alcohol Syndrome and Shaken Baby Syndrome

- We want to involve our consumers and self-advocates in decision making and remember the adage "nothing about us without us"

- We want to expand Inclusive Practices in our educational system

- We want full integration in society in all facets of life and work with our elected officials to change attitudes and pass positive legislation like the passage of the ABLE Act that will assist people with disabilities in all facets of their lives.

Throughout the years, The Arc and I have been blessed with many wonderful, hard-working supports groups like our three Parents of Down Syndrome groups in Monroe, Pike and Lackawanna counties and our three terrific Board of Directors; our general board, The Arc of NEPA Foundation and the Friends of The Arc Auxiliary; committed volunteers all to help forward our mission...and what can I say about the fabulous Arc staff. They are simply "the best". Two weeks ago, we celebrated our 60th anniversary at a Gala whose theme it was that "Magic Happens at The Arc". We hope to continue that magic for years to come.

On another note:

We are so proud of Miss Sara Wolff who has recently returned from The Arc US National Convention where she received a National Catalyst Award for her work in Public Policy for the passage of the Able Act. Congratulations Sara and thank you for your hard work. You are an inspiration to us all. Sara is a prime example of what a single person can accomplish and achieve with the proper supports from family, friends and community. No one can achieve success alone.

As we approach the holidays, may you and your family and friends share in the "Magic" of the season!


Sara Wolff: 2015 Arc National Catalyst Award Winner


The first ever **Arc Catalyst Awards** were presented at the Arc National Convention on October 5, 2015 in Indianapolis, Indiana. Awards were presented in the areas of: **Public Policy Victory of the Year, Self-Advocate of the Year, Small Business Employer of the Year, National Employer of the Year, Entertainment Industry Excellence, Philanthropist of the Year, and Federal Government Advocate of the Year.**


The Arc's own **Sara Wolff** was a winner of the Victory in Public Policy category in recognition of her personal quest to secure passage of the ABLE Act (**A**chieving a **B**etter Life **E**xperience). This legislation, now law, is the most comprehensive legislation to support people with disabilities since the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). It will enable persons with disabilities to establish tax-free savings accounts to pay for life needs such as transportation, education, and medical care.

Other winners in this category, along with Sara, were the bill's major co-sponsors, Senator Bob Casey (PA) and Richard Burr (NC), and seven additional legislators who ensured passage of the Act. Senator Casey, a close friend of Sara's, offered recorded comments of gratitude via a large screen video link, and singled out Sara for her courage and passion in promoting the ABLE Act through public appearances and her "Change.org" online petition, which garnered nearly 300,000 signatures in support of ABLE.

The Arc of NEPA is humbled and proud to be so closely associated with Sara Wolff, and congratulates her, along with advocates for disability rights from across the nation, on this prestigious national honor.



will never stop advocating for children and adults with disabilities. They are entitled to have a full and respected life," he told the group. Finally, he transmitted a picture of a billboard from 2015. Smiling faces of consumers and staff pictured was a powerful reminder of what was. The Executive concluded, "In 2015, for our 60th Anniversary, we celebrated the magic at The Arc with a gala and so many more anniversary events that happened throughout the year. 
