World Down Syndrome Day March 21, 2018

WHEREAS, approximately one in every 700 babies in the United States is born with Down Syndrome, making Down Syndrome the most common chromosomal condition. About 6,000 babies with Down Syndrome are born in the United States each year; and

WHEREAS, there are an estimated six million people with Down Syndrome in the world today; and

WHEREAS, people with Down Syndrome possess a wide range of abilities, and are active participants in educational, occupational, social and recreational circles of our community; and

WHEREAS, starting in Singapore in 2006, the date 3-21 has come to represent three copies of chromosome 21 (hence 3-21) and has developed into a movement to celebrate and value people with Down Syndrome around the world; and

WHEREAS, on December 19, 2011, the United Nations General Assembly declared March 21st as World Down Syndrome Day; and

WHEREAS, people with Down Syndrome should have equal opportunity to achieve the universally desired goals of self-fulfillment, pride in their achievements, inclusion in their community, and reaching their fullest potential.

NOW THEREFORE, I, William L. Courtright, Mayor of the City of Scranton do hereby proclaim March 21, 2018 as "WORLD DOWN SYNDROME DAY" and encourage citizens of Scranton to work together to promote respect and inclusion of individuals with Down Syndrome and to celebrate their accomplishments.

MLK Day of Service 2018 -

The Arc-US along with the Corporation for National and Community Service (CNCS), the federal agency that leads the Martin Luther King, Jr. Day of Service, has awarded The Arc-NEPA a grant to organize service projects where our men and women volunteer alongside community members to provide food to people in the community who are in need. We are working with United Neighborhood Center to gather as many non-perishable items as we can to fill Angel's Attic on Olive Street (approximately 100 people visit the pantry on a daily basis).

There was a weekend-long list of activities sponsored by the MLK commission for folks to participate in and be a part of the celebration.

As a part of the MLK celebration, The Arc-NEPA is helping to collect, organize and distribute canned goods and non-perishable food items. We have and will continue to contact area grocery stores to ask for donations.



Students through United Neighborhood Center's Leaders in Training program left bags on doorsteps in our area and collected them on January 15th. The children then brought the items to the food bank for distribution.

Local radio stations, TV networks and the newspapers promoted the collection.

Giving Back to the Community...

Thank you to CNCS and The Arc of the United States for giving us this opportunity to be a part of a greater whole. Our folks work to stock the shelves at UNC-NEPA Angel's Attic Food Bank. The supplies fed between 500-600 families throughout the winter months. We learn a lot from this experience such as: our help is



needed everyday, people are very giving, kind and generous, just ask; our folks are hard workers and love what they do; Angel's Attic is a wonderful resource to the community and a welcoming space where people are given what they need; So, let's keep the momentum going, let's fill the food bank all year and ensure folks have what they need to keep their bellies full. Appointment News



I am very excited that I have been selected to be a member of The Governor's Advisory Committee for People with Disabilities. We will meet 4 times per year in Harrisburg to

advise the Cabinet on disability issues. 60% of the committee must include members who either have a disability or a family member who have a disability. This is a great opportunity to discuss and bring attention to many issues facing our families

and individuals, in such crucial areas as DSP and TSS shortage, including recruitment and retention initiatives for quality professionals and consistent budgetary funding options, inclusive community and workplace opportunities for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities and family engagement and partnership with educational agencies and school districts.

This statement is taken directly from the application explaining the origin and the role of the committee:

"In 2006, Gov. Rendell signed Executive Order 2006-09 establishing the Governor's Cabinet for People with Disabilities (Cabinet), which is responsible for making recommendations to the Governor as to disability issues. The Cabinet further serves as the Governor's liaison to the public and as a resource to state agencies. The Cabinet is made up of 12-14 designated heads of agencies who serve by reason of their position, with the Secretary of the Department of Human Services serving as chair.

In addition to the Cabinet, the Executive Order created the Governor's Advisory Committee for People with Disabilities (Advisory Committee) to advise the Cabinet on disability issues. The members of the Advisory Committee are individuals from the community appointed by the Governor.
























Arc Update

The Arc of NEPA and The Local Right to Education Task Force had an information table along with other area agencies that offer support and services to families with autism. Advocacy Update

It is with great pleasure that The Arc announces the news that we are now the first Arc chapter in the Commonwealth to provide a full time on-site facility advocate at one of Pennsylvania's state centers. March 1, 2018, marked the advent of The Arc of NEPA working in partnership with Disability Rights Pennsylvania (DRP) to provide advocacy for individuals residing at White Haven State Center. This marks an historic chapter in Arc NEPA advocacy as our own Samantha (Sam) Donahue has assumed the role as full time facility advocate at White Haven. Sam is representing our agency in her highest characteristic manner during her short time in this new and critical role. This most unique relationship between The Arc, DRP, and White Haven State Center is grounded in dedication to the health, safety, welfare, and quality of life for over one hundred individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities who call White Haven home. The overarching Arc position on community living

as a preferred option is well known, however, advocacy is at its strongest when it recognizes each unique living circumstance and preference, and ensures the best outcome for each person day to day. Those who are identified for community placement will be greatly assisted by Sam as a function of her advocacy role. For everyone else, individual rights, planning, and overall well-being will be closely monitored via a myriad of regular protocols our advocate is engaged in. With that, Sam and the administrative team will follow a jointly prescribed mission with DRP and White Haven State Center to ensure the needs and rights of those living at the center are met. To ensure objectivity, the Arc of NEPA would be recused from any referral to our own services. Kudos to another valued Arc "MVP"-Mr. Kyle Juice, for in initially filling the role prior to Samantha's post. New Employee Referral Bonus Program

The Arc of NEPA regularly seeks potential candidates for employment who can assist us in providing quality programs and services. The Arc of NEPA employees are encouraged to help us in this endeavor by referring interested individuals who meet the qualifications for available positions.

In return, The Arc of NEPA shall provide the following referral awards:

- A \$150 bonus will be awarded to an employee whose referral is offered employment and works a minimum of 30 days beyond date of hire.
- An additional \$250 bonus will be awarded to the same employee after successful completion of the referral's 90-day probationary period.

The following program rules apply:

- 1.) Referring employees are required to submit a a New Employee Referral Bonus Application (available in the Human Resources (HR) Office) to HR within 10 calendar days of the referral's date of hire.
- 2.) All current agency employees, excluding Human Resources personnel and Departmental Directors with hiring authority over the referred candidates, are eligible to participate in the New Employee Referral Bonus Program.
- 3.) Temporary employees, substitute personnel, and former Arc employees referred for employment do not qualify as referred candidates for purposes of referral award eligibility.
- 4.) In order to receive payment as outlined above, the referring employee must remain actively employed by The Arc during the referral's length of stay requirements for purposes of referral award eligibility.
- 5.) In the event that more than one employee has referred the same individual for employment, the reward will be split equally between the referring employees who meet the requirements of this program.
