Programs and Services



Vision - People with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD) are entitled to live full, self-determined and respected lives.

Mission - The Arc promotes and protects the human rights of people with IDD and actively supports their full inclusion and participation in the community throughout their lifetimes.



Adult Day - Qualified, caring staff provide supports uniquely designed to meet individual desire and need. Both facility based, community integrated and virtual opportunities for personal growth and social interaction are offered. In addition, the Adult Day Service offers support to promote the continued development of communication and job readiness skills. Services are available: Monday - Friday 8:30 a.m. - 3:30 p.m.

Supported Employment - assists adults with IDD gain and maintain employment. A Job Coach is available to meet the needs of each individual. The Discovery process enables interested folks with IDD who are seeking employment with an employer who values and needs the talents they have to offer.

Advocacy - to promote and protect the civil rights of children and adults with IDD. The Arc's professional advocates provide assistance and information sharing to individuals and families on such matters as available supports, public education, employment and housing. Information is shared with local, state and federal legislators to ensure policies promote the best interest of individuals with IDD.

Recreation - Informed decisions are born from a variety of experience..! Fun filled, diverse opportunities to enjoy companionship, new places and things are the heart of Arc Recreation Services. Thursday evening events, bowling league, day trips and a summer day camp ensure smiles!

Community Residential Program - trained employees assist individuals in various aspects of household routines such as shopping, laundry, cooking, budgeting and entertaining. Each residence is staffed twenty-four hours per day, seven days per week.

Supported Living - with the assistance of a Coach, individuals are empowered by promoting increased independence and control in financial matters, socialization and recreation, employment and in maintaining a home or apartment.

Lifesharing - offers an opportunity for an individual with IDD and a family or individual to share their lives. Dedicated and trained families open their homes and embrace the individual as part of their family.
